

Blaisdell-Emery Trail

Part of the Tuna Valley Trail Association network of trails.

Sheet 1 of 2

0.0 mile: North Trail Head: The trail head can be found on Owens Way west of the Owens Way exit from US 219. The trail sign is 250 ft. south of the street. Park on either side of the trail before the sign. The trail begins on an abandoned railroad bed.

0.2: Trail descends and passes under US 219. On the east side it immediately ascends to rejoin the railroad bed.

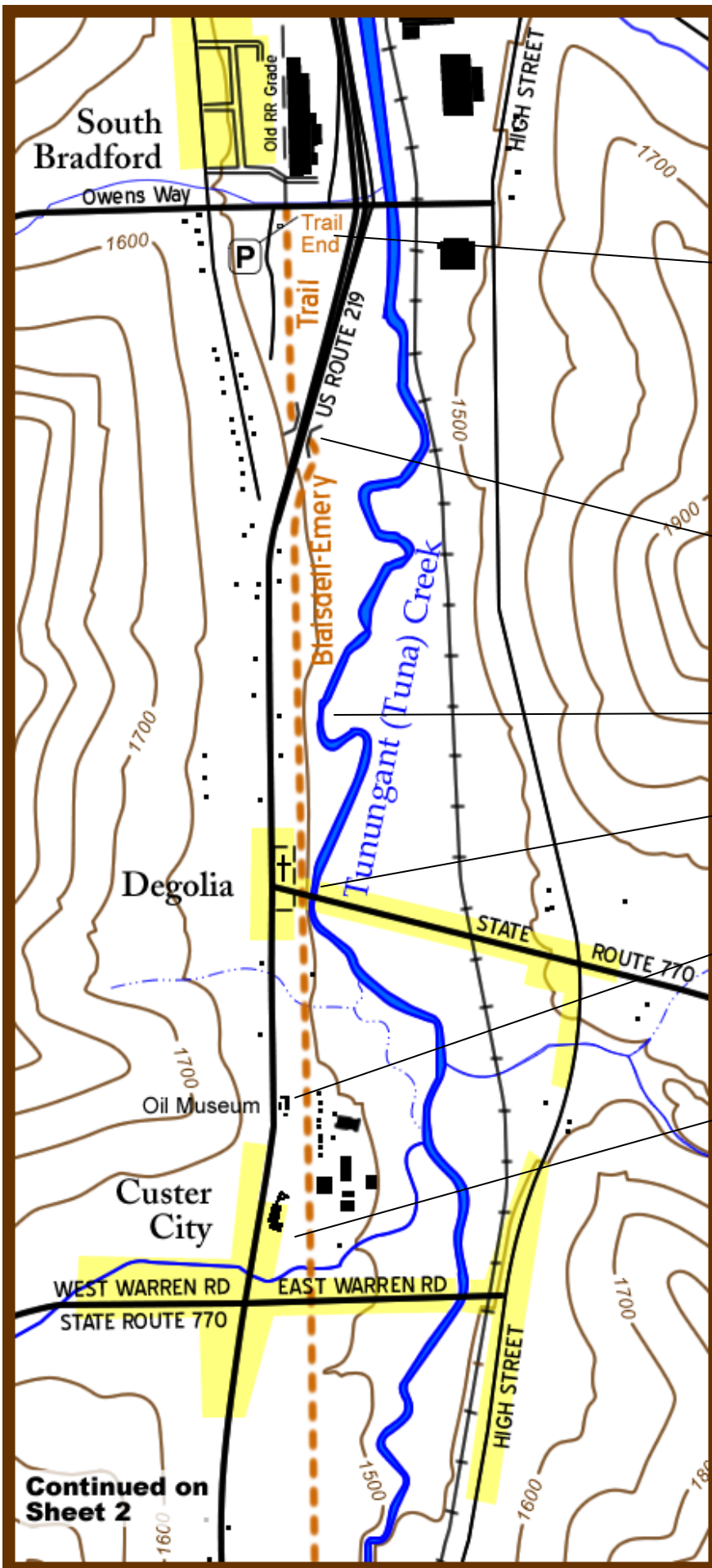
0.8: Tuna Creek passes near the trail on the left side.

1.0: Trail crosses Minard Run Road (State Route 770) in the village of Degolia.

1.3: Penn-Brad Historical Oil Well Park located on US Route 219 is on the right. The derrick of the standard oil rig can be seen from the trail.

1.6: Village of Custer City. The Custer City School Building which now houses Beacon Light Behavioral Health Systems can be seen on the right. Shortly afterward the trail crosses Shepherd Run, then East Warren Road.

Trail continues south to Lewis Run. See Sheet 2.

- 2.9 mile:** Trail crosses Tuna Creek.
- 3.0:** Trail crosses Brown Town Road. To the left at the active rail line was once Howard Junction, a railroad station.
- 3.3:** Tuna Creek passes near the trail on the right side.
- 3.3:** South Trail Head near the gate to Keystone Powdered Metal in the Borough of Lewis Run.
